Electoral Register

Other official records

- THE sample frame of choice for major surveys
 - ★ Almost all government surveys
 - Labour Force
 - British Crime Survey
 - General Household Survey
 - * BARB
 - * National Readership Survey

- Updated quarterly
- Easily available
- Almost universal coverage
- Even includes properties not yet built

- Includes non-residential addresses
- Separate Small User File
 - * Removes large businesses
 - ★ Many smaller businesses and organisations remain
 - ★ Typically around 10% deadwood

- Crucially, it is a sample of addresses, not individuals (or even households)
- Have to deal with multi-household addresses
- More importantly, have to deal with selection of individuals within households

- Selecting Individuals
 - * Kish Grid
 - ★ Next birthday
 - ★ Head of household or spouse

- Over-samples people in smaller households
 - ★ Someone in single-adult household bound to be selected
 - ★ Each person in a six-adult household has only a one in six chance of selection
- Good for samples of households, bad for samples of individuals

- Oversampling of small households needs to be corrected by weighting
- But this weighting increases the sampling error
 - ★ Weight = no of people in household, so range of weights is high
- The effective sampling size is reduced by c15%
 - ★ you are paying for 1,000 interviews and only getting 850 interviews' worth of data

- Oversampling of small households can be avoided
 - ★ Only interview at every other single-adult household found
 - * Attempted once on NRS, but unpopular with interviewers
 - ★ Could be worth trying again

Electoral Register

- Plus
 - ★ Sample of individuals, not addresses
 - More suitable for most surveys
- Minus
 - * Severe coverage problems in wake of Poll Tax
 - Now largely overcome
 - ★ Only compiled once a year
 - Three months out of date when released, fifteen months out of date at end of its life
 - New rolling register will alleviate this

Electoral Register

- Now wholly unusable for research
 - ★ People given right not to appear on the publicly available version
 - * As many as 25% in some areas chose to do this

Local Authority Records

 Council Tax Register is usually up to date, and can separate domestic from residential property

BUT

 Not publicly available, so useful only for the authority itself

- High and growing ex-directory rate
- UK 36% overall London 50%+
- Epsem samples impossible by normal methods

Effects of ex-directory

Under-represented Over-represented

urban rural

younger older

female male

- Directory plus n not a solution
 - ★ Originally Directory +1, then became more sophisticated
- Unlisted numbers tend to be clustered
 - ★ If 10 consecutive numbers are unlisted then directory + any number from the first one will yield no listed number
 - ★ the chance of any number being selected depends on the proportion of the previous nine numbers that are in the directory

- Random Digit Dialling (RDD) used widely in the US
 - ★ Mitofsky-Waksberg
 - * List assisted
- Several times attempted without success in the UK
 - ★ Cost of dealing with non-working numbers
 - * Lack of knowledge about the numbering system

- A ten digit telephone numbering system allows 1 billion numbers
 - ★ only 20 million households
 - * vast majority of possible numbers are not in use
 - ★ how do you find out which these are, short of ringing them?

- The 01727 exchange allows 1 million numbers, for a town of 50,000 people
 - ★ But all start with either 8 or 7
 - This immediately reduces total possible to 200,000
- More information now available from Oftel over and above exchange listings
 - ★ Can identify blocks of 100,000 numbers that you know exist
 - Working blocks still contain huge numbers of non-allocated numbers that must be winnowed out

- The Noble-Moon experiment
- Empirical mapping of number system using large scale tele-marketing databases
 - ★ 15 million numbers, so can map nearly the whole system
- Identifies nearly all 100 banks currently in use
- Random sample of 100 banks
- Where working line found. fixed no of working lines drawn in 100-bank
- Yields 66% working lines at second stage

- Specialist agencies now sell RDD samples
 - * Epsem
 - ★ List-assisted
- Pre-dialled with auto-dialler to weed out non-working numbers

Quota Sampling

- Choosing the variables
 - ★ Correlate with key variables
 - ★ Correlate with availability

Quota sampling

- Setting the targets
 - ★ Census the most reliable
 - ★ Available at very local level
 - ★ Can be very out of date
 - Quotas set today would still need to be based on 1991 Census

Quota Sampling

- Constituency-level quotas can be set on basis of national figures
 - ★ tweaked to reflect known differences from norm, eg social class
- Enumeration district (ed) level quotas need
 to reflect the nature of that ed
 - ★ Interviewers' task must remain possible
